




# RADIO SAI FOR CHILDREN

Dear Children,



Two friends had to go to another village for work...




On their way they had to pass through the woods. They saw a rider carrying a bag on the horse's back, ahead of them.




LOOK..he dropped something !!






Listen to me very carefully...I will go and eat some food and get some packed for you too. After that we will sell the gem.









He finished his meal, took the parcel and left to purchase poison.

Greed had corrupted him. He poured the poison into his own friend's meal.









While his friend was gone, he gazed at the gem greedily. He thought about the enormous wealth it would fetch him. But suddenly he was struck on the head very hard.
