


## CHAPTER 9 THE ONSET OF CHOLERA








A hunting community called Boyas lived in the same street as Kondama Raju's house.




Kondama Raju directed some of them to be Sathya's bodyguards. He instructed them-




Sathya's movements couldn't be monitored despite such precautions.




Sathya's intentions were not to disobey

home to be with Him.





A deep affection for Sathya made the young lads move with Him constantly. One day, out of fear, one of them said-
