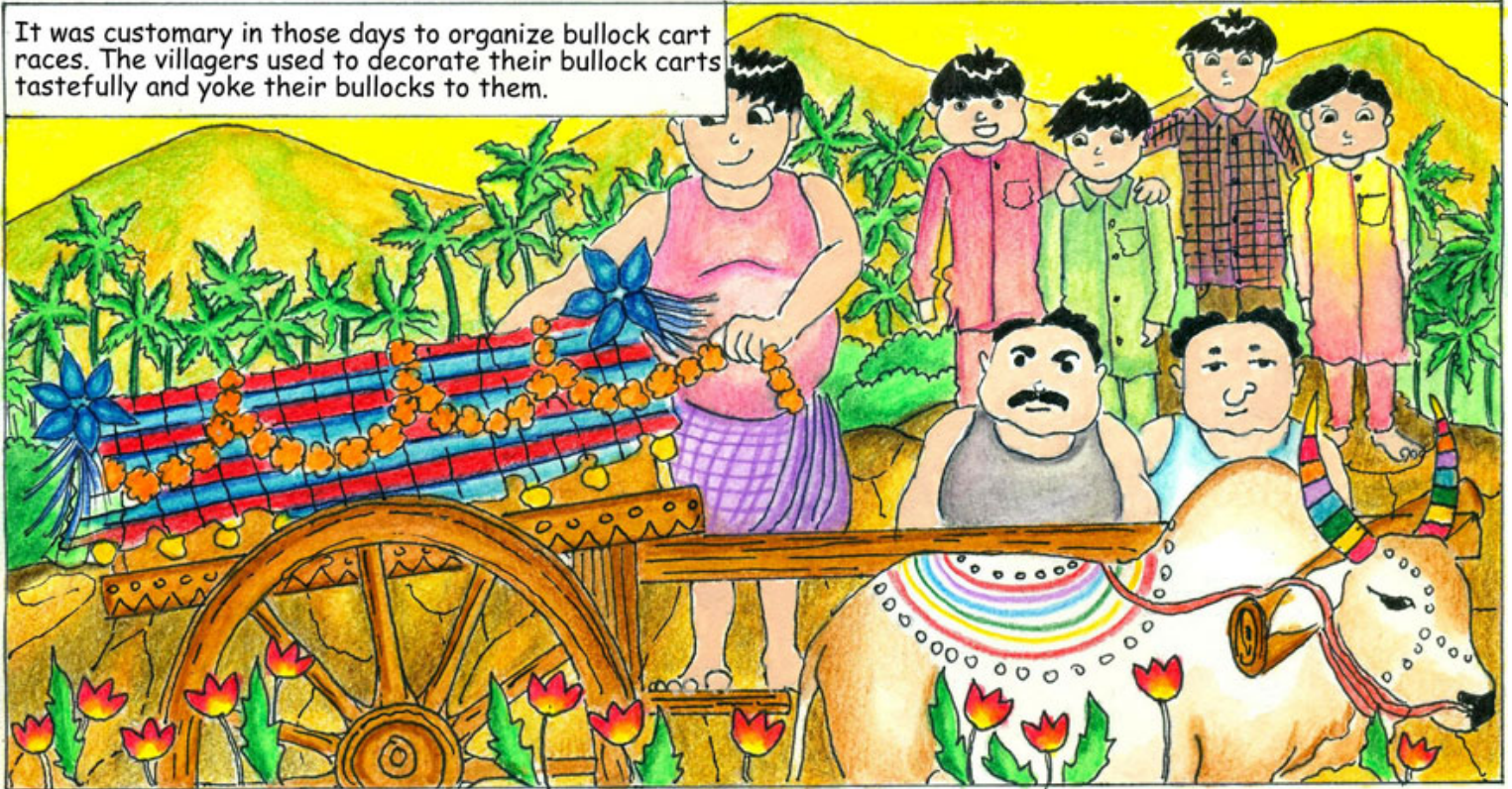


CHAPTER 5

Ten to fifteen people with large sized tummies used to sit in those carts and make the bullocks run faster in the sand, by whipping them mercilessly.

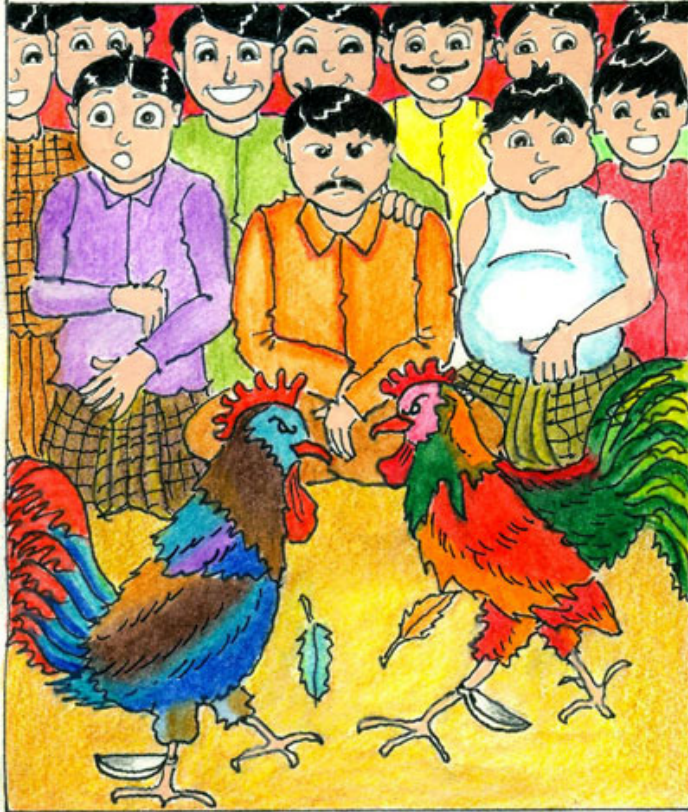


Unable to witness the great torture those animals were made to undergo, Raju used to call the children and tell them...

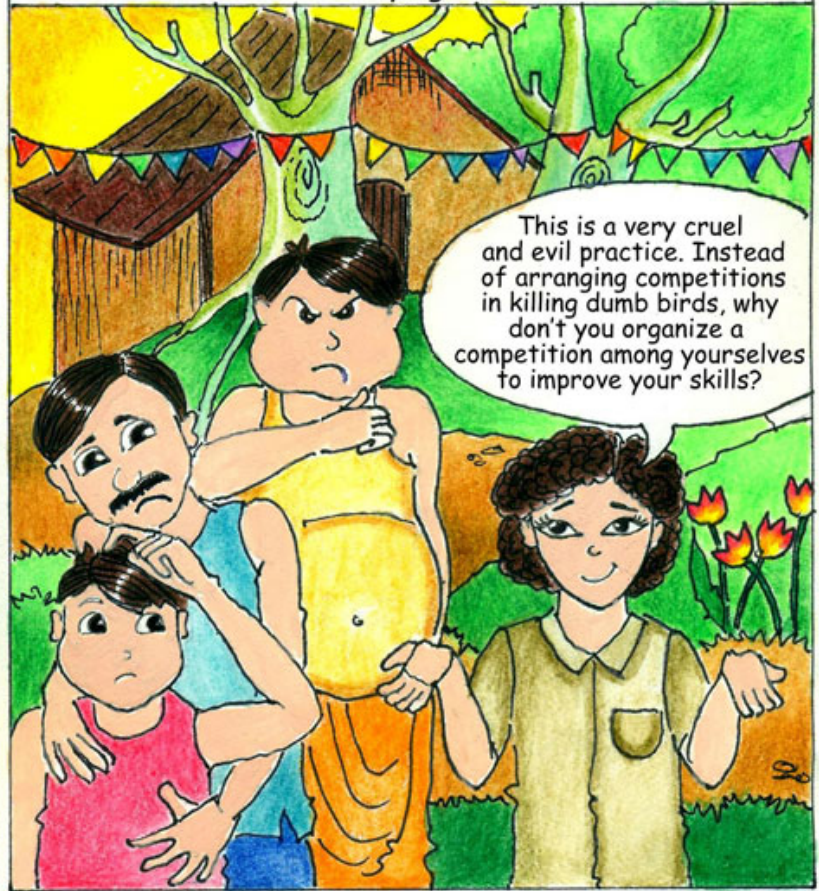


Thus, he brought about a transformation in the elders through their own children.

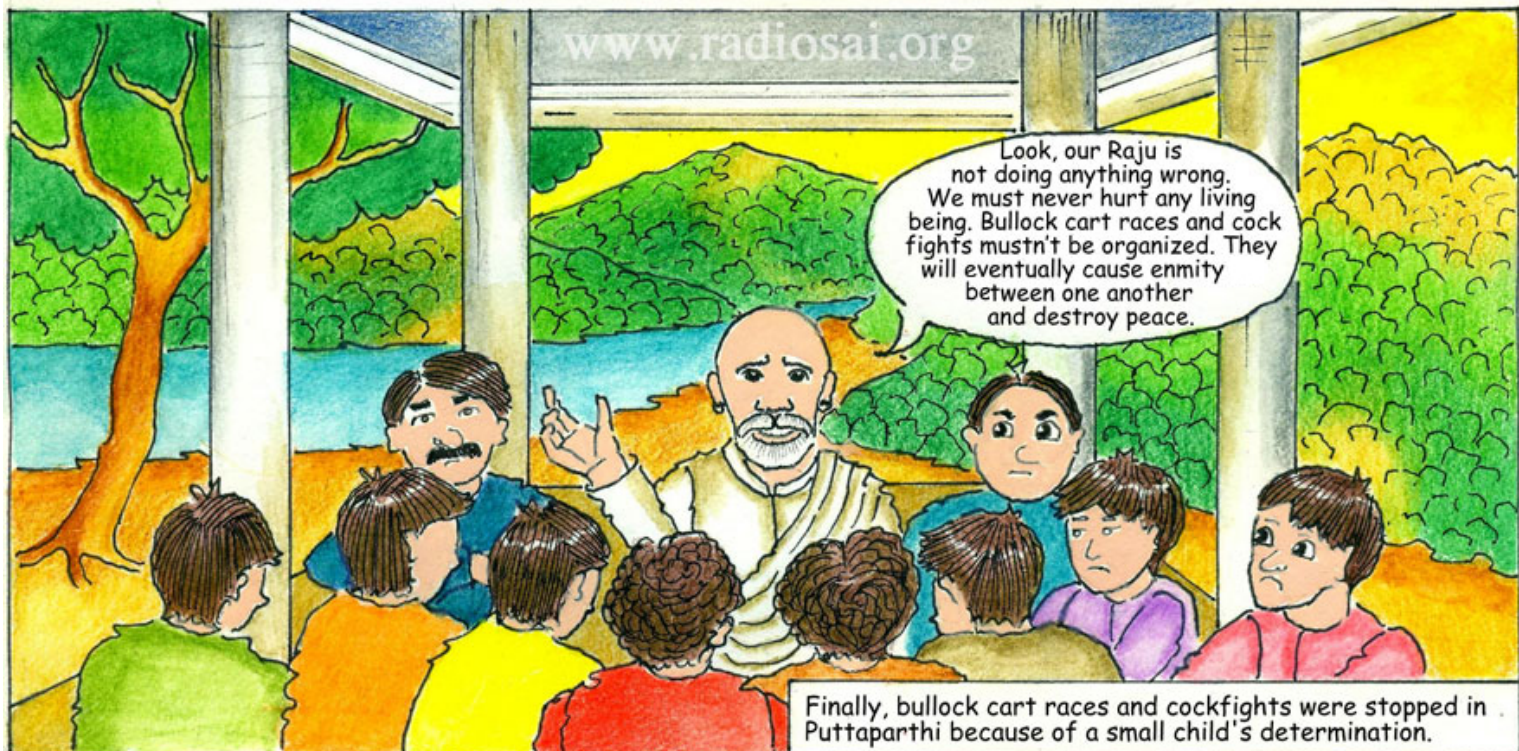
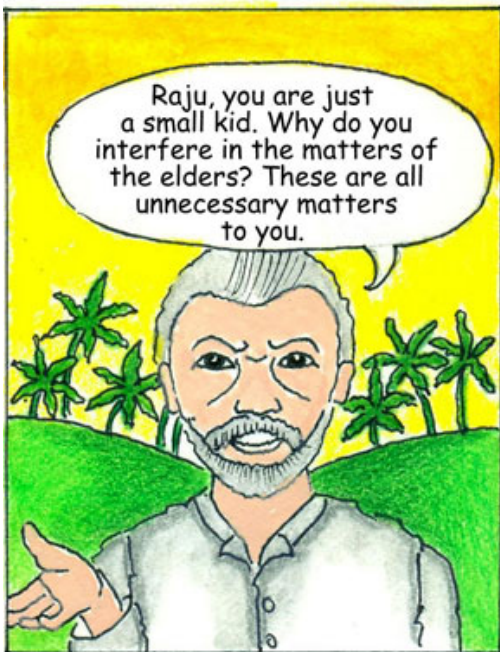
Competitions in cock fighting were also being held in those days in the villages. Knives were tied to their legs and they were encouraged to fight with one another. It was a fight intended to kill the other.
