





THE POET OF POETS






Men had started wearing wrist watches. The Karnam flaunted a wrist watch as it was considered a sign of a rich man. The boys sang against it.




The small patch of moustache similar to that of Hitler's also became a vain trend. The Karnam was chided for it through poetry. The next day he shaved off his moustache.





